Patient Rights and Responsibilities

Rights

Responsibilities

- Patients have the right to be treated with dignity and respect.
- Patients have the right to fair treatment without discrimination because of race, religion, gender, ethnicity, age, disability, sexual orientation, or source of payment.
- Patients have a right to clear, understandable information from staff and providers.
- Patients have a right to confidentiality regarding their treatment. Information about a patient's treatment can be released only with authorization by the patient or legal guardian, in emergencies, or if required by law.
- Patients have a right to clear explanations of any and all limits of confidentiality.
- Patients have a right to clear understanding of their conditions and treatments.
- Patients have a right to profes-sionally relevant information about their providers, for example their Licensure, specialties, and years of practice.
- Patients have the right to know about their treatment choices, regardless of cost and whether or not those choices are covered by insurance.

- Patients have the responsibility to treat staff and providers with dignity and respect.
- Patients have the responsibility to respect other patients including their confidentiality and privacy.
- Patients have the responsibility to be on time for their appointments or to call as soon as possible if they need to cancel visits.
- Patients have the responsibility to provide information that providers need to give appropriate care.
- Patients have the responsibility to share in the formation of their plan of care.
- Patients have the responsibility to follow their treatment plans and to ask questions about their treatment plans if anything is unclear.
- Patients have the responsibility to follow their medication plans if medication is involved in treatment. Patients must tell their providers about medication changes, including over the counter medications and those from other providers.
- Patients have the responsibility to pay all copays, deductibles, and self-payments at the time of service.
- Patients have the responsibility for all costs not covered by insurance.
- Patients have the responsibility to tell providers if they have any problem paying fees.
- Parents are responsible for their children at all times.
